Post MOSUG meeting, Adult Obesity Management & Prevention Group meeting minutes

1. Review of meeting agenda

- a. Obesity screening extends beyond a BMI: Debra provided an overview of evidence-based obesity screening guidelines informed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
- b. Ottertail County reported on SHIP research study involving several clinics adopting evidence-based guidelines for adult obesity screening and counseling.
- c. Ottertail County PHN (Linda Westby) provided a field report of the EB AOM guidelines with effective outcomes.
- d. **5210** tool: Kristin explained how to use the tool for screening: assess daily intake of fruits/veggies, screen time, physical activity and pop. The tool, based on EB guidelines, recommends the following per day: 5 fruits/veggies, 2 hours, or less, of screen time, 1 hour PA, and 0 intake of pop. It is being used in the SHIP study.
- e. **Exercise is Medicine** website: Kristin stressed the benefits of this website to provide practitioners/providers with evidence-based guidelines for influencing adoption of routine physical activity.

- f. **Adult Obesity Management & Prevention** website: Debra announced the need for volunteers to help develop/construct the website that is intended for Omaha System Users, practitioners, PHNs, educators and others.
